

A NOTE FROM CAMMANDO COWBOY

In January we had the pleasure of shooting with Commando Cowboy. Sean as Eureka's nephew. He sent us an email giving us a little of his background and thanking us for our courtesy. Following is his e-mail. We hope you enjoy.

My name is Capt. Sean Randall. I am currently stationed at Spangdhlem Germany. It is a Fighter Wing with A-10 and F-16's jets. We also have C-17's which we affectionately refer to as heavies. They are not nearly as sexy as the fighter and attack planes but they are imperative when there is a need to move beans and bullets down range. I will end my time in Europe in August of 2014 then proceed to my next assignment. My family consists of my wife Sandra of 22 years and my two children Ally and Bryce. Ally is a sophomore in college in California and Bryce is a senior in High School. Bryce plays football and wrestles. He just took 1st place on Saturday at a wrestling meet in Belgium. Competing athletically in other countries is a dynamic experience for our military children when stationed abroad.

I love to bow hunt, travel and sing with my family. Last March I had the pleasure of running a half marathon in New Orleans with a Colonel I met while deployed and later that month another one in Germany with my daughter. Staying physically, emotionally and spiritually fit is important for me and those I serve.

I am an Air Force Chaplain. Thank you for making me feel a part of the family and thank you for loving on my Uncle Jimmy (please keep loving on him until you literally love the "hell" right out of him, no pun intended):) Thanks Uncle Jimmy and thank you Eldorado Cowboys for the opportunity to fling some led and meet some great Americans.
